When he became a Director of the Hornsby RSL Club and later on the President, he was invaluable helping the Snooker Club improve the facilities of the Billiard Room and assist in any way he could running tournaments. As you can see the Billiard Room is still one of the finest around due to his efforts.

He will be sorely missed. I don't think anyone who remembers him will forget his great Scottish accent, his sense of humour and love of 'a wee dram'. Guaranteed, wherever he is in the great billiard room in the sky, he will be making 147's. Rest in peace.
